INSTRUCTIONS FOR ACS(I)

The application for the following MOE Pre-University Scholarships will open on 10 January 2025:

- Art Elective Scholarship (AES);
- Bicultural Studies Programme Scholarship (BSPS);
- Engineering & Tech Programme Scholarship (ETPS)
- Language Elective Scholarship (Chinese);
- Language Elective Scholarship (English);
- Language Elective Scholarship (French):
- Language Elective Scholarship (German);
- Language Elective Scholarship (Japanese);
- Language Elective Scholarship (Malay);
- Language Elective Scholarship (Spanish);
- Language Elective Scholarship (Tamil);
- Music Elective Scholarship (MES); and
- Regional Studies Programme Scholarship (RSPS).
- 2. Deadline for the online submission of scholarship applications is 24 February 2025.
- 3. The National Elective Tamil Language Programme Scholarship (NETPS) will open on 3 March 2025 to 3 April 2025.
- 4. To be considered for the above Scholarships, applicants must be:
 - a) Singapore Citizens
 - b) Not currently be in receipt of any other MOE scholarship (except Edusave Scholarships)

Application and Nomination Process for IP Students

- 5. Interested students can visit https://go.gov.sg/MOE-Local-Scholarships for the details on the scholarships and application process. To apply for the scholarship, a valid SingPass account with 2-Factor Authentication (2FA) is required to access the application system. Details on the application for a SingPass can be found on the SingPass website. As the set up for SingPass Myinfo may not be immediate, we strongly encourage students to complete their SingPass application early to avoid encountering technical issues close to application closing. Students can log in to the application system through Singpass and register as a new user to create an account using their personal valid email account. After an account has been successfully created, they may log in using their Singpass to access the application form. application period-ends.
- 6. Schools are requested to inform students of the application process/submission deadlines and assist students who are interested in applying for the scholarships.
- 7. After the application period, we will be collating the submitted applications and provide schools in March/April. Schools are required to provide your recommendations by indicating if these applicants are nominated for the respective scholarships and let us have your completed returns through the scholarship system by the stipulated deadline.

8. Schools are to adhere to the nomination criteria and assigned scholarship quota for their schools as reflected in Table 1.

The Art Elective Scholarship (AES) nominees are to upload their Art e-portfolios onto a secure file sharing application (e.g. Google Drive, DropBox) and send the links to the school's AEP teacher-in-charge by 27 March 2025, and the e-portfolio submission template should reach Mr Ng Eng Joo at ng_eng_joo@moe.gov.sg by 2pm on 28 March 2025. The Music Elective Scholarships (MES) nominees are to upload their Music e-portfolios/videos onto a secure file sharing application (e.g. Google Drive, DropBox) and send the links to the school's MEP teacher-in-charge by 27 March 2025, and the e-portfolio submission template should reach Mr Ng Eng Joo at ng_eng_joo@moe.gov.sg by 2pm on 28 March 2025. Submission of Portfolios for AES and MES Candidates

Prior to the interview, all students must submit a personal portfolio which should include documentation of active involvement in art-related activities within or outside of school and can include:

AES

- Mini visual tasks and assignments that show a range of different media or artforms
- Works to show your artmaking processes. For example, research and gathering of information and data, ideation, brainstorm, development of ideas, exploration and experimentation of ideas and materials
- Pages from your sketchbooks and journals

Prior to the interview, all students must submit a personal portfolio which should include documentation

MES

of active involvement in music-related activities within or outside of school and one of the following:

- A video-recorded performance on an instrument or two instruments of your choice comprising 1 to 2 works or movements lasting 4 to 7 minutes in total.
- A composition portfolio comprising 1 to 2 works lasting 2 to 5 minutes in total with accompanying audio recording(s) of the work(s).
- A video-recorded performance on an instrument of your choice comprising 1 work or movement of about 3 to 4 minutes AND a composition portfolio of 1 to 2 works adding to about 1.5 to 3 minutes with accompanying audio recording(s) of the work(s).

The performance must be recorded within the last academic year (i.e. Year 4/Sec 4).
